### How will we measure impact and outcomes in the coming year?

- Keep and share the register for clubs with governor responsible for sports grant monitoring – both after school and lunchtime.
- Seek staff feedback / input on their coaching/ confidence levels.
- Seek school council/ sports crew input on progress.
- Seek parent feedback (via questionnaire) on level of sports offered at school
- Use Philosophy for Children session to discuss ‘healthy living’, ‘well-being’ and ‘competitiveness’ with pupils.
- Monitoring visit by governors to observe sports crew work and/or inter-school competition.
